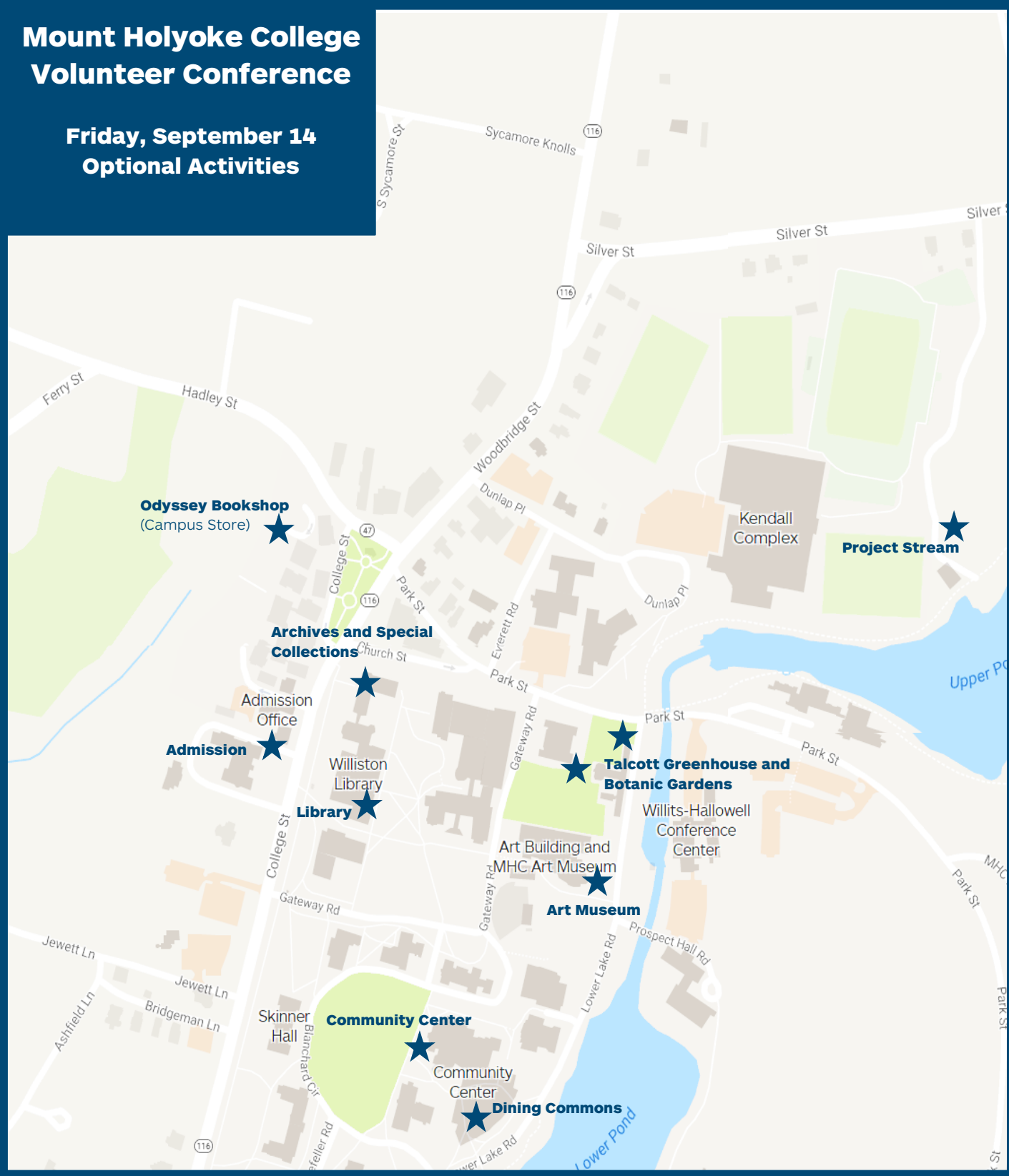

Project Stream

Self-guided tour

Project Stream offers visitors an ADA accessible boardwalk that meanders through forested wetlands alongside the stream. A trail kiosk and interpretative signs along the boardwalk invite visitors of all ages to learn about the importance of wetland functions, the types of plant and animal species they may discover in the wetland, and the science and practice behind the Project Stream restoration.

Talcott Greenhouse and Botanic Gardens

The Botanic Garden's diverse and dynamic living collection includes more than 2,000 different types of plants from six continents distributed throughout the greenhouses and outdoor gardens. These rich botanical resources provide collaborative opportunities for academic departments, programs and centers across campus.
